Environmental Review Board (ERB) Reminders for Exterior Home Improvements — As the spring and summer months approach, as a friendly reminder, to please double check with your respective clusters regarding what exterior home improvements require an Environmental Review Board (ERB) to be submitted for board approval prior to scheduling. To view your clusters ERB guidelines, please check out the Newtown Grant website at www.newtowngrant.org, then click on the Master Board & Clusters tab and then your respective cluster. ERB guidelines and forms can be found on the right hand side of the screen. For any questions or additional information, please contact your associated cluster property manager for assistance.

PER NEWTOWN GRANT RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING TRASH CAN(S) STORAGE:

- Trash bins and/or trash bags shall not be permitted to stand along the outside wall of any building
- All non-recyclable trash shall be in bags that tie closed and be placed within trash bins with a top closure.
- Trash bins and recyclable trash containers shall not be placed outside until the evening before the scheduled trash pick-up no earlier than 7:00 PM.



- Trash bins and recyclable trash containers shall be removed from the street returned inside as soon as possible, but no later than 9:00 PM on the day of pick-up.
- Society Place Condominiums use dumpsters and initiates an immediate and un-waivable fine of \$50 per bag/box left on the ground and not deposited in trash bins. This fine escalates with each infraction

RECYCLING MADE SIMPLE

Learning how to properly recycle is very important! The following information is provided for you to clip and post as recycling guidance.

Recycling Guidance:

- Only recycle items larger than a credit card; loose bottle caps go in the trash
- Recycled items should be clean and dry
- Do not place your recycling in plastic bags
- Cardboard boxes should be broken down into flat sheets

Items that CAN be recycled:

- Plastic: Milk, food, beverage & laundry detergent containers, with the lids on or off
- Paper: Newspaper, white and colored office paper, junk mail, envelopes, magazines, letters, cardboard, phone books
- Metal cans including aluminum and steel/tin

Items that CANNOT be placed in our residential recycle containers:

- No Styrofoam or polystyrene, including cups, carry out containers or packaging material
- No plastic bags or plastic wrap or plastic utensils
- No paper plates, paper towels, napkins, tissues or crumbled up paper
- No food or liquids
- No paper containers that contained milk or juice (since they are plastic coated)
- No batteries or electronics
- No chemicals or containers that contained chemicals such as oil or paints
- No garbage, diapers, wood or plant materials
- No clothes, shoes, toys, tools, wood or bio-waste such as syringes

RECYCLING - FACTS AND FIGURES

Empty soda and food cans are a natural resource. Recycling steel and tin cans saves 74% of the energy used to produce them. Aluminum cans are 100% recyclable. Americans currently discard about 2.7 million tons of aluminum each year. Of that, only about 50 percent is recycled. Apart from the economic impact, the environmental benefits of recycling metal are enormous. Producing aluminum and steel from mining is damaging to the environment. Recycling one aluminum can saves enough energy to run a television for three hours.

Most people call them "tin cans," but the containers your canned foods come in are mostly made of steel, with a micro-thin coating of tin inside, to protect the flavor and prevent the can from corroding. Americans use about 100 million steel cans every day. That's 36.5 billion cans a year. About 71% of steel cans are recycled, making them one of the most recycled packaging products in America. Recycling steel saves at least 75% of the energy it would take to create steel from raw materials. That's enough energy to power 18 million homes.

Paper products make up about 71 million tons (or 29%) of the municipal waste stream. Fortunately, upwards of 63% (45 million tons) is recycled annually. Approximately 334 pounds of paper is recycled for every person in the United States. Recycling just one ton of paper saves trees and enough energy to power the average American home for 6 months.

Unfortunately, many Americans do not recycle properly, largely because little guidance is provided. Improper recycling leads to challenges for the recyclers, and many materials have to be rejected as waste instead of being recycled. For example, if a large bundle of material has an item that is inappropriate, the entire bundle is sent to a landfill. In addition, materials such as grocery bags and other flexible plastics will get caught in the recycling machinery. Though using reusable bags is best, many grocery stores have containers to accept and recycle plastic bags.

PICKLEBALL COURTS COMING TO NEWTOWN GRANT....SUMMER 2023!



HOME IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

Spring is in the air...many people take this time to get started on home improvement projects they've been contemplating. With that in mind, here is some information to help assure that your home improvement project runs smoothly...

- Don't forget to please check your clusters Environmental Review Board (ERB) Rules and Regulations first and to please submit ERB Request Forms to your designated cluster association property manager for such exterior structural work that requires it. Each cluster association owner can find their respective cluster ERB guidelines as well as contact information for their property manager on the Newtown Grant Website which is: https://www.newtowngrant.org/
- When choosing a contractor, make sure they are registered with the State of Pennsylvania and they provide you their HIC (Home Improvement Contractor) number. You can check to see if a contractor is registered by going on the following website: http://hicsearch.attorneygeneral.gov
- It's also a good idea to check with other agencies such as the Better Business Bureau and Department of Consumer Protection before choosing a contractor.
- Make sure all required approvals and permits have been secured before you or your contractor
 begins work. Information and forms can be found on Newtown Township's website
 www.newtownpa.gov or you can contact the Newtown Township Codes & Zoning Office for
 assistance. Don't forget, any exterior structural work that requires and ERB submission can not
 start until you have received permission from your cluster association board and respective
 property manager.
- If your project requires digging, you or your contractor must contact PA One Call (www.pa1call.org or dial 8-1-1) at least 3 to 10 business days before you dig IT'S THE LAW. PA One Call will contact the utility companies to mark their lines with paint, flags or stakes. It's important you see marked lines on your property before digging takes place so no accidents occur...keep in mind that careless digging could result in serious personal injury, environmental damage and costly delays.
- Finally, you should always make sure that all of the proper inspections are completed including a
 - final inspection before you pay your contractor the remaining balance due upon the job's completion. If you're unsure what inspections have been completed, you can contact the Newtown Township Codes & Zoning Office for this information at 215-968-2800 extension at 242 or 265.

Some Benefits of becoming a Volunteer Firefighter:

1. To help others

The primary job of firefighters is to keep people in emergency situations safe. This often includes rescuing them or their property from fires, conducting emergency medical procedures and providing support in search and rescue operations. Fire departments may also help their communities through educational and charity events. This gives volunteer firefighters the opportunity to be a positive influence in their communities.

2. To meet people in your community

Fire departments are often community-oriented and primarily recruit staff members from their local area. This gives firefighters the opportunity to get to know their neighbors in the workplace. These interactions can help build stronger communities and work relationships. Getting a job as a volunteer firefighter may be especially helpful for people who are moving into a new locality and want to meet members of their community.

3. To stay in shape

Firefighting is a job that can be very physically demanding. Firefighters often operate heavy machinery, carry water and transport injured emergency victims. Fire departments often have strict fitness requirements for their employees and firefighters exercise regularly to prepare themselves for emergency situations. Finding a position as a volunteer firefighter may give you a good reason to increase and maintain your physical fitness.

4. To prepare for a full-time position

In many areas, there are more firefighter candidates than open jobs. If you want to become a full-time firefighter but can't find open positions, you can consider temporarily working as a volunteer firefighter. This experience can teach you many important firefighting skills, increase your fitness and build your resume for future applications. Working as a volunteer firefighter can also allow you to meet other professionals in the field who may be able to help you find jobs or provide references.

5. To work after retirement

Volunteer firefighters work part-time and often have a lot of flexibility in their schedule. This can make it an ideal job for retirees who want to continue working or who want to serve their communities. 6. To find purpose

Volunteer firefighters often have the opportunity to help people during the most challenging parts of their lives. They may help preserve houses and property or even save lives in emergency situations. This makes firefighting a very meaningful job for many emergency professionals. If you are looking for a job that can give you purpose, it might be helpful to consider a job as a volunteer firefighter.

7. To learn new skills

Volunteer firefighters go through an extensive training course just like full-time firefighters. This training prepares them to complete a wide variety of tasks in emergency situations. Many of these skills are very valuable and have many applications outside of emergency services. Some of the skills you might learn when training to become a volunteer firefighter include cardiopulmonary resuscitation, emergency injury treatment, driving skills, teamwork and leadership.

8. To receive benefits

While volunteer firefighters don't receive regular salaries like full-time firefighters, many departments provide their volunteers with different types of compensation. Some fire departments provide reimbursement for transportation costs and some reimburse volunteers for their training.

Other departments may give bonuses for responding to calls or attending trainings.

9. To have flexibility

Volunteer firefighter positions often offer community members the opportunity to help their communities while maintaining a flexible schedule. While most volunteer positions require firefighters to attend regular trainings, they rarely require set hours or schedules. This can make volunteer firefighting an ideal side job for parents or for people who work other jobs.

10. To build camaraderie

Firefighters have a unique and challenging job and train hard to earn their positions. This often creates a sense of camaraderie among firefighters and other emergency personnel. If you are looking for a work environment that provides strong friendships, it may be beneficial to pursue a volunteer firefighter position at your local fire department.

MAILBOX MAINTENANCE

Inspect your mailbox every spring and fall season to ensure that it is in good condition. Remember that snow coming from a plow can be extremely heavy causing a mailbox in poor condition to come down. Is your mailbox sturdy? Plastic mailboxes tend to become brittle with age. Make sure that the door on the mailbox is closed tightly, if the door is open or missing then the mailbox may "fold" on impact from the snow. Is the wooden post straight and in good condition? The township is not responsible for a



mailbox that is hit due to it leaning into the roadway. Be aware that an old rotted wooden post can easily break from the impact of snow.

Mailboxes (mainly pertains to single family homes in Newtown Grant) should be located so the face of the mailbox is 6-8 inches back from the edge of the roadway. This is according to USPS guidelines. Newtown Township Public Works suggests that you put them as far as 15 inches back from the road edge.

Did you know that Newtown Township is one of the few Townships that have a reimbursement policy for damaged mailboxes during snow plowing season. Please visit their website at newtownpa.gov for details and requirements regarding the policy.

THINK SPRING – GARDENING WITH COFFEE GROUNDS

With Spring flowers starting to peep up from the soil, you might have begun planning for your Spring garden. An ingredient you may already have around your home and regularly toss out may provide a useful and inexpensive additive for you to nurture a healthy and vibrant garden – coffee grounds!

Plants, such as vegetable plants, grow well with the addition of coffee grounds. One such example is tomatoes, which thrive from the increased nitrogen, phosphorous and potassium. Some other plants, like carrots and radishes, will grow larger and sweeter with coffee grounds. Blueberry plants and evergreen trees also like acidic soil, and would benefit from the addition of coffee grounds. When you mix coffee grounds into your soil, you introduce nutrients that fertilize and otherwise help the plants. And, using coffee grounds can be a great alternative to traditional chemical fertilizers.



To use, you can add coffee grounds directly to the soil in your garden by sprinkling the grounds on top or scratching them into the top few inches of the soil. You can also steep the grounds in a bucket or large container of water for a few hours or overnight to make a liquid fertilizer concoction that can be poured or sprayed onto your plants.

If you are adding the grounds directly to the soil, be careful not to pile up the grounds or apply too much, since you do not want to create a water resistant barrier for your garden nor do you want to overfertilize and cause plants to turn brown. If you are in doubt, less is more, and if you are uncertain whether or not a plant likes acidic soil, a quick google search can help you determine if using coffee grounds will help the specific types of plants in your particular garden!

Some gardeners also swear that coffee grounds are great for pest control. The caffeine and other compounds in coffee have been found, in some instances, to deter slugs, snails, some beetles, and possibly ants. Coffee grounds may also be used in your compost bin, to absorb and/or eliminate noxious odors.

If you do not drink coffee and have your own used grounds, coffee shops, diners and other businesses that sell brewed coffee may be willing to bag up their used grounds for you. One example is Starbucks Coffee, which launched a program in 1995 to give gardeners and farmers their used coffee grounds on a first come, first served basis in order to provide customers with an inexpensive way to enrich compost and garden soil while advancing its efforts to balance the Company's environmental impact. Simply ask your local barista (or other business owner) if they have any coffee grounds available for gardens – in most instances they are more than happy to provide you a free bag! Happy Gardening!

If you obtained a Fob last year, and do not have an outstanding balance on your homeowner association account, the Fob remains active so long as you continue to be a resident of Newtown Grant and do not have an outstanding balance. If you do have an outstanding



balance, your Fob has been deactivated and will be reactivated once your account balance has been paid. Key Fobs of any former residents of Newtown Grant have also been deactivated.

If you did not obtain a Fob or you are a new resident of Newtown Grant you may obtain a Fob for access to the pool providing your homeowner account is in good standing with a zero balance and you can show proof of residency within Newtown Grant. There is no cost for the initial Fob. Instructions will be forthcoming about when you can visit the clubhouse to obtain your Fob.

Additionally, if you were issued a Fob that you lost, a new Fob can be issued to you at a cost of \$10. Your old Fob will be deactivated.

Pool guidelines are published on the Newtown Grant website (www.newtowngrant.org). The guidelines and rules will be updated prior to pool opening to assure their accordance with current CDC or Bucks County Department of Health requirements.
